MONARCH BUTTERFLIES HAVE A HOME IN CLEAR LAKE

With reports showing that the monarch butterfly population is shrinking,

Central Gardens of North Iowa submitted for and is now qualified as a Monarch Butterfly Waystation.

Central Gardens is the perfect spot for these beautiful butterflies, with nearly

three sprawling acres of over 20 themed gardens. But you don't need acres of land to help these travelers.



This is an incredible accomplishment. According to ISU entomology professor Steve Bradbury, the loss of habitats in the U.S. and forest degradation in Mexico have contributed to the Monarch's decline. They rely on milkweed and flowers for their habitat. The larvae use the milkweed for their diet, and the females lay their eggs on these perennials.

Want to help the Monarchs? You can simply plant milkweed or biennial or perennial nectar plants in your yard. Or if you prefer to see these majestic butterflies at Central Gardens, grab your camera and visit us.

BACK TO SCHOOL AT CENTRAL GARDENS

The site Central Gardens is located on had been home to four Clear Lake schools over a 100-year period, from 1888 to 1988. When it was formed in 2000, Central Gardens took its name from Central School, the last school that had been on this ground.

Those roots are still evident today with the variety of programs and events Central Gardens provides that serve to educate and inform people of all ages about horticulture, gardening, habitats, and the environment. But, stroll through the grounds, from the School Bell Gazebo to the magnifying glasses standing ready in the Bee Happy Discovery Garden to the bronze barefoot boy perched on a tree stump with a book, and you'll find out even more about our heart for learning.

Bricks and pavers form the pathways that meander through Central Gardens, telling stories about its history and about the hearts and lives of those in our community. And now, for a limited time, Central Gardens is offering a significant discount for brick and paver purchases to commemorate a special event or person in your life. Order a standard size brick for just \$200 or a 16" granite paver for \$800 before Labor Day, September 6, and have them placed in one of the following pathways:



- >> The Alumni and Faculty Walks, located on the north edge of the property on either side of the Moon Gate, are lined with bricks and pavers that honor or memorialize those who have attended or taught at any of the Clear Lake schools since the first school was built in 1855.
- >> The Wedding Walk, also located on the north edge of the property, in between the Alumni and Faculty Walks, commemorates weddings and anniversaries.
- >> The Hero's Walk runs north of the Nature Education Pavilion, behind the Sentinel and beneath the flag. It serves to honor the many kinds of heroes that are among us or have died before us.
- >> The Gardener's Walk is a long stretch outside Mother Earth's Workshop that is open to bricks and pavers of all kinds.
- >> Likewise, the Reunion Terrace, west of the Ceremonial Lawn, is also open to all kinds of bricks.
- >> The Rotary Walk, which starts at the south bridge, honors Rotarians from across lowa.

In addition to bricks and pavers, Central Gardens has just 6 cubes left to form the 12-seat Council Ring located on the Activity Lawn. For just \$1,500, you can support the mission of Central Gardens and leave a legacy. The cubes are made from native lowa limestone and measure 18" on all sides.
