## Pavers and Pricks and Cubes



Did you get married this summer? Celebrate an anniversary? Welcome your first grandchild? Or your tenth? Remember a mentor from high school? Celebrate a life? Encounter a hero? Have a milestone birthday? Appreciate a garden enthusiast? Stumble upon a meaningful quote or passage?

Now you can memorialize the meaningful events and memories of your life with a commemorative paver, brick, or limestone cube in beautiful Central Gardens. The 16" granite paver is ideal for short passages, epitaphs, and family names. It starts at \$1,000 and includes up to 144 characters.



A personalized standard size brick is just \$250 and will honor, commemorate, or memorialize the special people and events in your life in the Gardens for years to come.

For \$1,500, you can have a seat in the Council Ring and leave a legacy in Central Gardens. Seating in the Council Ring has been expanded from twelve to eighteen limestone cubes. The cubes are made from native lowa limestone and measure 18" on all sides. Pricing includes up to 30 letters. Additional letters are available for purchase.
