CAPITAL CAMPAIGN PROJECTS COMPLETED

The following enhancements to the grounds at Central Gardens were completed this fall. They were funded by the Upgrade 2020 Capital Campaign that was completed in June. More projects than were originally budgeted were made possible because volunteers stepped up to do most of the installation work, thus saving labor costs.



- Two tables and eight chairs were added to the seating on the Nature Education Pavilion
- Two additional sets of tables and chairs now sit under the School Bell Gazebo at the main entrance
- The Gazebo also got a much-needed facelift with a brick surround that expands the staging area, plus the addition of two new bulletin boards and a new guest registry
- Close to the Gazebo is a new, littler, Little Free Library for even littler children along with a gorgeous new wooden bench for seating in between the two libraries.
- A new arch entrance to the Bee Happy Discovery Garden will greet children who visit this magical space
- Each entrance to the Gardens has a sign with QR codes and each of our 20+ gardens has a sign identifying it
- A new limestone path leads from the main path to the Council Ring
- The Cutting Garden was re-designed to enable more sales at Fresh on Friday events.


- Five new umbrellas for the patio tables on the Victorian Terrace at the Nature Education Pavilion.

The Survey Says

Central Gardens issued a brief survey to 124 members with email addresses to gain insight into how we might attract more members. The response rate was high with 39 members (31%) completing the survey. Currently, Central Gardens has 157 individual/family memberships and 20 corporate members. For 2022, our goal is to grow individual membership by 10% and corporate membership by 50%.

We asked members how they would explain to others why they should consider becoming a member of Central Gardens of North Iowa. The majority of members were evenly split between (1) Central Gardens is an asset to north Iowa and its mission is beneficial to our community and, (2) the beauty of the grounds is worth supporting and provides a peaceful retreat for all.





TIPS FROM THE GARDENS: Poinsettions

Maintain the beauty of your holiday poinsettias by following these tips from Paul Ecke Ranch, poinsettia grower in Encinitas, California:

- When bringing the poinsettia home from the store, protect it from chilling winds and temperatures below 50 degrees F
- Make sure the plant gets at least six hours of indirect sunlight each day
- Remove poinsettias from decorative containers before watering.
 Water only when soil is dry to the touch
- After the plant finishes blooming, feed it with a balanced, all-purpose fertilizer
