YOUTH PROGRAMS

The Bee Happy Discovery Garden is an organic, specialty garden within Central Gardens with 11 raised beds, an arbor, bean tepee, bee house, and a chicken coop. A variety of vegetables, herbs, and flowers are grown in this garden that is designed to foster learning, exploration, creativity, and play in children of all ages.

Connectedness to nature is positively linked to children's psychological wellbeing and development and has been found to improve concentration, learning, creativity, cognitive development, cooperation, flexibility, and self-awareness. It has also been found to prevent childhood obesity. Other studies suggest that is essential for young children to develop a healthy microbiome, or personal microbe ecosystem, and establishing a close relationship to dirt, nature, and eating veggies fresh from the garden can help to achieve that as well.

Through garden development and thoughtful programming, our goal is to provide youth with an interactive garden space that inspires curiosity, builds knowledge, kindles passion, and strengthens respect for all living things. This summer, Central Gardens will offer three programs targeting different age groups. All of our youth programs are free and open to the public.

Garden Explorers take place every Friday morning throughout June, July, and August. This program is for all ages but primarily for kids from 2–12 years old. Kids can help water, feed the chickens, pick and taste vegetables, observe pollinators, and feel empowered to be a partner to mother nature. The garden serves as a sensory playground where creativity and discovery abound!

In addition to volunteer led garden activities, each week various community partners provide their own activities to educate and inspire, providing rich programming and connecting families with entities they may not already be familiar with. Some of our community partners include Healthy Harvest of North Iowa, Clear Lake Arts Center, Clear Lake Public Library, Lime Creek Nature Center, and many more.

A new offering this year is **Bugs and Blooms**, a program ideally suited for youth in 3rd through 5th grade. This three-session class will allow kids to dig in a little deeper into how nature works and build practical skills through fun gardening activities.

Middle School and High School students can participate in **GROW!**, a program designed to be very flexible for this busy age group. There will be a variety of areas to explore, including gardening, cooking, community service and more. We will team up with the local food pantry and the Cerro Gordo lowa State Extension to help reduce food insecurity. Our new Italian and Asian cooking gardens will provide an opportunity to learn about other cultures as well as how to prepare some dishes using these vegetables. Youth may also choose to help out with the Garden Explorers or sell produce and bouquets on Friday mornings.

Come visit the Gardens on a Friday morning this summer and you'll find the garden all abuzz with laughter and learning! Adults are welcome too!
