GOLF CROQUET AT CENTRAL GARDENS

The origins of croquet are cloudy. It may have started in Africa and made its way to Ireland and then on to England. The original illustrations in Lewis Carroll's Alice in Wonderland, published in 1865, show Alice playing croquet. The Wimbledon Club began in 1868 as the All England Croquet Club. Its logo is Lawn and Tennis Club. And it is that heritage that has the Wimbledon tennis tournament players wearing white and playing on grass courts.

The game came to North America with the English colonists and later spread as a popular backyard family game. Organized croquet began in the United States post WWII. In the 1990s, a new flavor of the game, golf croquet, emerged and has enjoyed popularity worldwide. Golf croquet is a simpler form of the game, with fewer rules and a faster format than the more formal 9-wicket game.

Golf croquet is played at Central Gardens on the Ceremonial Lawn, and there is no charge for instruction and use of equipment or facilities. Join us on Sunday afternoons at 2 PM for an introduction to golf croquet, followed by open play at 3 PM. Organized groups play on Monday and Thursday mornings.
