Central Gardens of North Iowa is excited to announce that, beginning January 1, it will participate in the American Horticultural Society's (AHS) Reciprocal Admissions Program (RAP), and that's good news for our members. RAP promotes horticulture across North America by encouraging people to visit gardens and other horticultural institutions. The program boasts more than 345 participating gardens and arboretums in 48 states, the District of Columbia, Canada, and the Caribbean.

While admission to Central Gardens is always free, other gardens across lowa and across the country do charge admission and parking fees. "A 2023 membership card to Central Gardens is your ticket to free admission, free parking, and free or discounted admission to programs and events at gardens across America and beyond," says Becke Dorenbush, Central Gardens president.

You'll find seven other organizations that are also participating in Iowa, including Greater Des Moines

Botanical Garden, Vander Veer Botanical Park in Davenport, and Reiman Gardens in Ames. Do you winter in Florida? More than 40 gardens and arboretums participate in RAP across that state. With hundreds of participating gardens across North America and in the Caribbean, there is likely to be one near your next destination.

All-American Selections is an independent non-profit organization that tests new, never before sold, varieties for the home gardener. Founded in 1923, its mission is to promote new garden varieties with superior garden performance judged in impartial trials in North America. Each winter, AAS announces flower and vegetable winners of its field trials. As a demonstration garden, Central Gardens will receive free seeds and seedlings

to plant and signs for identification. For several years, Central Gardens has planted AAS winners in the Plant of the Year and Bee Happy Discovery Gardens. Information about Central Gardens will be posted on the AAS website to encourage visits by gardeners from across the country.
