## CENTRAL GARDENS TO HOST SECOND ANNUAL PUMPKIN PALOOZA



Last year, Central Gardens expected about 300 guests for its first-ever Pumpkin Palooza. It welcomed 780. It was a good problem to have. Volunteers have organized a celebration of all

things pumpkin for even more people this year with additional games, more pumpkin painting stations, and food trucks on site. This will truly be a fun event for children of all ages!

So, for an afternoon of fun, family-friendly, and free entertainment this fall, plan to come to Central Gardens of North Iowa for the second annual **Pumpkin Palooza on Saturday, October 14, 4 PM – 7:30 PM.** Rain date is Sunday, October 15.

From 4 PM to 6 PM, we'll have carved pumpkins on display, over a dozen kids' activities, including pumpkin painting, art

projects, a story walk, pumpkin-themed games, apple cider and popcorn. Adults can learn new ways to decorate with pumpkins, take in some music, and take photos with their favorite people at the pumpkin-themed photo station. There will be gate prizes for both children and adults!

Then, from 6 PM to 7:30 PM, carved "Pumpkins on Parade" placed along the pathways of Central Gardens will be lit up, illuminating a fun and festive eve. Last year, over 60 businesses, nonprofit organizations, and individuals participated in the parade, carving pumpkins to be enjoyed by all. All individuals, businesses, and organizations that would like to display a carved pumpkin for the parade are invited to do so. We'll even supply the pumpkins!

Isn't it fascinating that one tiny seed holds all the genetic material of a lustrous plant? Save a seed and preserve all that you love about a plant! Perhaps it's the plant's beauty or taste you want to enjoy again next year. Maybe its resistance to disease and time it takes to bloom are things you want to preserve. Seed saving is a way to preserve a plant regardless of the desired qualities and no matter the reason, seed saving engages us in the rich cycle of life.

Seed


Some benefits of seed saving include preserving heirloom varieties, encouraging genetic diversity, and saving money. According to Regeneration International, age-old heirloom varieties are disappearing at an alarming rate and 90% of the crop varieties grown 100 years ago are already gone.

A male plant produces pollen which is carried to a female plant by the wind or by a pollinator. Some plants have both male and female parts and are often called true flowers as they self-pollinate. In both instances, the pollen makes its way inside the female plant, where it connects with the ovaries and produces seeds.

Some plants are easier to save seed from than others. If the plant is open pollinated the offspring will be a true type with the same look and taste as the plant from which it came. However, if the plant is a hybrid, this is not the case, so while it's possible to save these seeds, it will not be a true type and the results will vary.

Seeds mature in different ways in different places for different crops, and the ideal time and method for gathering seeds varies. Bean seeds are a great crop for beginner seed savers as they ripen in the pod. Select the pod after it has dried, open it up and collect the seeds. Then let them dry on a paper towel for a week or so and package them in an envelope or a small glass container and be sure to label it. Zinnias, marigolds, and poppies are a few flowers for which seed saving is also easy. No matter how the seeds are collected, ensure they are dry and hard before storing them in a cool, dry location. Get saving and have fun!
